In the middle of a desert, Gabriela finds God


Seventeen-year-old Gabriela lives in a village outside Lima, Peru, with her mother and younger brother. Built in the middle of a desert, their home lacks running water, forcing the family to wait for a tanker truck to fill their plastic barrel before they can drink, cook, or bathe.

Because Gabriela's father abandoned her family several years ago, Gabriela's mother carries the financial load. Her job as a housemaid barely fulfills the family's basic needs.

Recently, while trying to rise above her circumstances, Gabriela brought her brother to *Bread of Life*, a Bible program hosted by the Bible Society of Peru and made possible through generous supporters like you.

Every morning, volunteers serve a healthy breakfast — often comprised of quinoa, jam, milk, and bread — and reflect on a Bible story. The 15-year-old program shares Scripture with 500 Peruvian youth on a regular basis.

It was there, a volunteer handed Gabriela a Bible — the first she ever owned, a provision from caring donors. As she shared a nutritious breakfast with her brother, Gabriela opened her Bible and uncovered stories of hope, perseverance, and joy.

To build on her experience, Gabriela brought her brother and mother to a local church. The family now attends on a weekly basis. Even while living in the middle of a desert, they have embraced Jesus' life-giving water — eternal life through the Father who will never abandon them.

"But whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life" (John 4:14, NIV).



You can reach impoverished children with the love of God

In Peru, two out of three children live in extreme poverty, with as many as 25% suffering from malnutrition. The *Bread of Life* program provides impoverished children with nutritious meals and spiritual guidance. As part of the program, each child receives a colourful Bible storybook telling them about the life of Jesus and His love for every one of them.

GOD SPEAKS TO SANTOS AND BONNY THROUGH BRAILLE

"The Word of God is life. If you give me the Bible, you give me life."

Santos and his younger brother Bonny are two blind brothers. They became Christians during a tough time for their family, when rebels forced them from their home in northern Uganda. They struggled to survive on little food. But out of the hardship came an amazing opportunity. They received a braille Bible.

"The Word of God is life," says Santos, who is now 41 years old. "If you give me the Bible, you give me life. That is very important for me, but not only me — for everyone who is blind and neglected, who no one bothers with."

The brothers' fingers skim gently over a braille Scripture portion as they preach in their hometown of Lira. "I preach using my braille Scripture portions," says Santos. "I like the Gospel of John because it always talks about love."

"Some people don't see blind people as important," adds 36-year-old Bonny. "But we have God's favour on our

lives. My brother and I share the braille Bible, and we make sure to read our Bible every day."

Carmen found healing through the Bible

Carmen did not have an easy life. The third of eight siblings, this 17-year-old teenager from Petén, Guatemala, was abandoned by her mother at the age of five. At 12, she was raped and became pregnant.

Eventually, she entered the protection system but was separated from her siblings. To deal with the trauma, Carmen began to receive psychological therapy as well as medical and spiritual attention. One Sunday at church she took the decision to receive Christ in her heart. Two months after that, she enrolled in the *Free to Live* program with the local Bible Society.

Today, Carmen has a year-old child and her life has changed dramatically — thanks to your gifts that provide support and healing to those who are suffering.

"Now, I learn to love myself and take care of my baby," says Carmen. "He is a treasure that God gave me and I want him to know that true love only comes from God."

Thanks to God's Word, she has also learned to forgive those who once harmed her. "I also came to understand that to forgive is not to renounce the desire for justice and that it takes a lot of courage to forgive," says Carmen. "But I leave this in the hands of God knowing my life and my son's life are in His hands."

Over 10 years ago, a neighbour invited Peng to church. There, she discovered Jesus Christ, "the light of my world," she says. Because Bibles are not easily available in rural China, Peng received only portions of the Bible, but she made the best of it.

"I tried to read what I had," she explains. "The problem was that I worked in the fields all day and the only time I could read was at night. But we had no electricity. Night by night, I studied by the light of the kerosene lamp until my eyes were so damaged that I became blind."

Peng does not regret a minute of it! "Out of my darkness, I have found light," she says.

Friends like you helped provide Peng a complete Bible of her own and the grateful woman says she has more light in her life than ever before.

"My husband has become a believer in Jesus also," Peng says. "Each night he reads to me the words of life and hope. Every Sunday he leads me to church."

Although Peng cannot see with her physical eyes, she says, "In Ezekiel 12:2, some people 'have eyes to see but do not see.' That is not us. As we hear God's Word, we are filled with light."


Although Samuel occasionally attended church and had received a Bible in English, he could not fully comprehend God's love because English is not his native language.

Meet Long Qinmei from China

What if your Bible smelled of pig's manure? Would you still read it? Long Qinmei did. Because it was her one and only Bible.

During the Cultural Revolution, Long Qinmei kept her Miao language (language of the Miao people group, an ethnic minority group in Southwest China) New Testament Bible inside a box and hid it in a pigsty when authorities raided her house. And when she kept mum about the names of her church leaders, she was initially given seven years' imprisonment.

"By God's grace, the sentence was reduced to nine months. I was 34 then," recalls Long, who is 86 today, with eyesight and hearing still sharp and stamina still strong. "I was so happy to recover my Bible from the pigsty after I was released!"

Born into a Christian family of whom her grandfather was a church elder and her father a preacher, Granny Long has developed a deep longing for God. "My father left a huge impact on my life," shares Long. "Despite suffering from arthritis, he would use a crutch for support to climb up a hill at five in the morning to pray before Sunday service."



Single all her life, Granny Long lives alone but enjoys the solitude with God. At six every morning, Granny Long meets with God as she takes time to pray, read, and meditate on His Word. Despite



only having a grade four education, Granny Long reads both the Chinese and Miao language.

It is not surprising that elderly as she is, Granny Long gets invited to many churches to preach, share the Gospel, and do home visits. In fact, she is well-known amongst the Miao Church for her love and knowledge of the Scriptures. The living waters within her flow out to refresh many lives.
