

The people you help reach around the world know war, deprivation, and exploitation. They have deep first-hand experience of danger, oppression, neglect and abuse.

They eagerly seize God's Word as a lifeline. Hearing God speak gives birth to hope, and His Word transforms their hearts.

UKRAINE – OFFERING SOLACE IN THE FACE OF PAIN

The ongoing conflict has devastated countless lives. Tens of thousands have been killed, cities ruined, and millions displaced. Amid this despair, Ukrainian churches and organizations are determined to provide aid and spread the Gospel. Bible demand is surging, including in frontline areas, liberated territories, and displaced communities.

Last year, your gifts provided 150,000 Bibles and New Testaments: 39,500 regular Bibles; 11,000 youth Bibles; 52,000 NTs; 48,000 children's Bibles.

You have helped distribute more than 1.2 million Bibles and Scriptural resources since the war began.

**Soldiers regularly ask for prayer and tangible support. Chaplains continually reach out, pleading for spiritual literature for the soldiers. Pastors and priests are seeking Bibles and children's Bibles—essential tools for their pastoral care among those broken by war. One-fifth of the world's Bible Societies face disruption and danger due to conflict and violence. By providing as much funding as possible, CBS helps partners sustain translation, publishing, distribution and engagement efforts.

HAITI – SHINING A LIGHT IN A NATION IN CHAOS

In Haiti, despite the terror of warring gangs, the Bible Society perseveres in its mission. With 37% of the population illiterate, the Jesus film serves as a crucial tool for introducing people to Christ. Last year, over 50 screenings reached 60,000 people, leading to 170 new believers. Additionally, more than 2,500 schoolchildren received Bibles, each impacting 3-5 others.

Getting my own Bible is so special to me. I've wanted to read God's words for myself and feel closer to Him. Every time I open it, it's like He's speaking to me and bringing me peace." — Student in Haiti

PERU – FEEDING THE FUTURE FOR CHILDREN AT RISK

Peru, where 32% of children live in poverty, many are forced into labour, leaving education and hope behind. The Peruvian Bible Society addresses this by providing nutritious meals, Bible studies, and age-appropriate materials in 38 communities. In 2024, the program reached over 7,000 children, benefiting not only the kids but also teachers and families.

GHANA – RESCUING VULNERABLE TEENAGE GIRLS

The 2008 oil boom in western Ghana has fueled a rise in child prostitution. The Bible Society of Ghana empowers young girls to resist predators and pressures from family and peers. Last year, they distributed over 1,600 Bibles and 3,600 Scripture portions, reaching 8,500 girls through counselling and education on abuse, peer pressure, and teenage pregnancy.

NIGERIA – HELPING PEOPLE WHO LOST EVERYTHING

Multiple calamities in Nigeria have displaced over two million people, leaving them in overcrowded camps without basic necessities. CBS supports the Bible Society by providing clothing, bedding, toiletries, and Bibles, along with Bible-based Trauma Healing sessions. In the past year, over 2,000 Bibles, 1,000 sets of school supplies, and food were distributed.

BENIN – HEALING AND GUIDANCE FOR ORPHANS

Orphaned or abandoned children often face mental health and behavioural challenges, leading to isolation and trauma. In 2024, the Bible Society began training orphanage supervisors in spiritual guidance and child care. The program engaged 1,527 children last year and plans to expand to 10 orphanages, providing 5,000 illustrated Bibles for children.

GUATEMALA – RESCUING GIRLS FROM SEX TRAFFICKING

Guatemala faces a trafficking crisis, particularly among Indigenous girls exploited for sex tourism, domestic work, and forced labour. The Bible Society provides shelter, safety, and restoration, while working to prevent trafficking through awareness and education. In 2024, they conducted outreach and training, and in 2025, they aim to intervene with 400 victims and engage another 400 girls still in school.



We fore coming to the shelter, I felt like my life was over. I couldn't sleep without nightmares, and I didn't think anyone could love me. But through the sessions and reading the Bible, I learned that Jesus never left me. I'm learning to believe that I'm more than what happened to me."—María, 15

STANDING WITH THE CHURCH UNDER SIEGE

There's no hope here, but Jesus can bring hope. I'm trying to share this message of hope with other young people." —A persecuted believer

Across the Middle East, historic Christian churches and communities face violent attacks. CBS funds efforts to provide encouragement, practical support, networking, and solidarity.

CBS supports Bible distribution, Bible-based trauma healing, live-streamed worship and studies, children's drama teams, and outreach. The Bible Society visits dozens of churches and serves in numerous refugee camps each year.

Additionally, we assist ministries supporting Christians worldwide who endure persecution for their faith.

In two Middle Eastern countries*, a total of 3,039,500 beneficiaries, including those in diaspora, were reached through calendar deliveries, camp visits, church leader engagements, and the distribution of 250,000 printed Scripture copies, with 90,000 delivered in Iran.

- > Over 380 million Christians worldwide face persecution, with 12+ killed daily for their faith.
- > The persecuted church is the **fastest-growing movement**, and in some countries, Christians are seen as national security threats.
- > **Bibles are disguised for safety**, with each Bible reaching an average of three or more readers.
- > In persecuted areas, **home churches are raided**, and members often arrested.



THE SIGHT, THE SOUND, THE TOUCH OF GOD'S WORD

Every Deaf person who will come to know Jesus through this project will be a living testimony to the transforming power of the gospel." — Jacqueline, in Nicaragua

Tens of thousands of people with disabilities face poverty, neglect, and isolation, often cut off from education. Multiple Bible Societies provide Braille and audio Bibles, large-print materials, and sign language videos, transforming lives. They also run a Scripture radio show, a 'verse of the day' on Facebook, and add captions to DVDs for families. Their outreach includes local engagement, education, and advocacy, along with expanding church networks for those with visual or hearing impairments.

SIGN-LANGUAGE SPREADING AS A MINISTRY TOOL

BY MID-2025

- > The Bible Society of Lithuania is underway with sign language translation and videos from the Book of Acts, the Creation story, and other Old Testament events.
- > **The Cuban Bible Society** has begun the Book of Acts, to add to Bible stories already circulating on DVD.
- > **The Thailand Bible Society** focuses on outreach to Deaf believers, with 30 Genesis chapters and a Gospel of Mark summary in progress.
- > The Bible Society of Nicaragua recruited translators, built a studio, and began a sign language dictionary, completing drafts of 14 Gospel of Mark stories.
- > The Bolivian Bible Society, with trained translators, made strong progress on portions of Luke and 20 videos seeking community approval.
- > The Bible Society of Guatemala launched its first sign language translation with Mark and continued engaging hearing-impaired children in schools.

BEYOND WHAT WE CAN SEE

- > **The Bible Society of Kenya** reached 5,000 visually impaired people through churches, prisons, elder homes, service centres, and refugee groups.
- > **The Bible Society in Angola** launched new courses, equipped a new classroom with Braille typewriters and a printer, added Braille math resources, and expanded awareness.
- > The Bible Society of Uganda served over 5,000 people, focusing on Braille literacy, audio Scripture access, and training 100 facilitators.

Christians in China deeply treasure God's Word, especially in rural areas where false teachings are rampant. Without affordable or free Bibles, many would never own one. These Bibles are crucial for evangelism, as churches give them to new believers and seekers. With 96% of China's 1.4 billion people unreached, CBS has long supported Scripture provision by funding Bible distribution and subsidizing printing costs through Amity Press, making Bibles more accessible.



TRANSLATION INTO LANGUAGES OF THE HEART

A NEW ERA OF CANADIAN COMMITMENT

Anna is a 70-year-old woman in Benin. Although her legs trembled, nothing was going to stop her from hiking 10 miles to the site of the launch and celebration of the Bible—newly translated into her language, Fon. Anna walked for hours to bring just one Fon Bible home. There was joy in every step. Her children could now read the Bible, and their lives would be changed forever. For the first time in their lives, Anna and her family could read the Bible in their heart language. Now that Anna has God's Word in her native tongue, she can help her family and friends come to understand and embrace the Gospel of Jesus Christ."

TRANSLATION MILESTONES IN 2024

By UBS members around the world, including CBS

- > Overall, Scripture translations 105 languages for 580 million people
- > First translations 74 languages, including 13 sign languages, for 100 million people
- > New translations, revisions and study editions 32 languages for 480 million people

While significant progress has been made in translating Scripture, 53% of the world's 7,000+ languages have little or no Scripture. Many of these languages, spoken by small communities, are at risk of extinction. Bible Societies play a vital role in preserving these languages and their cultural heritage. In 2024, CBS expanded translation efforts to 22 unreached communities across Africa, Asia, Europe, and the Americas. Thanks to key support, we continue moving forward in faith to complete these projects, trusting in God's desire for all people to hear His voice—even as financial challenges remain.

WALKING WITH INDIGENOUS COMMUNITIES

**I was struggling with anxiety and my faith. I was lost. Through this (mentorship) program, I found practical help and a community that encouraged me to lean into my faith. As my faith grew, I began to see changes in my outlook, my habits, and even my character. I became more patient, compassionate, and even wiser and grounded in values. God was shaping me into the person I was meant to be." — Kyra, student leader from Ahtahkakoop Cree Nation

Indigenous Christian leaders are deeply concerned for their people's spiritual needs, facing a battle for their future. There's a growing demand for God's Word in their languages, and Bible translation is crucial for preserving their culture. Indigenous communities are embracing CBS programs like *Caring for the Wounded Heart* (Bible-based trauma healing) and *Overcomers* (Bible-based recovery and support program), both of which focus on community-based group study. CBS also distributes Bibles, Scripture, and resources to many Indigenous communities.

TRANSLATIONS YOU SUPPORTED IN FY 2025

- > INUINNAQTUN SCRIPTURE PORTIONS Audio recordings of selected passages and a Gospel of Mark film were completed in Inuinnagtun, with several Scripture portions finished since 2017.
- COMPLETE BIBLE IN BLACKFOOT This long-cherished dream of the Blackfoot people began with discussions, experimentation, training, and project setup and now is making steady progress.
- > COMPLETE BIBLE IN INUKTITUT (REVISION) The revision team, now with seven new community reviewers, is updating the Inuktitut Scriptures and will produce a children's Bible format, audio New Testament, and Mission: Literacy series.
- > **NORTH ALASKAN IÑUPIAQ OLD TESTAMENT** Translation of the Old Testament is underway for the Iñupiaq language, alongside audio recordings of Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Psalms 1-50.

BRINGING HOPE: THE CHRISTMAS REFRESHER TOUR

In partnership with I Am Compelled, CBS supported the Christmas Refresher Tour, providing essential resources like Bibles, sticker books, comics, warm clothing, and other items to four remote Indigenous communities. As

over 100 children, youth, parents, and grandparents received gifts, hope, and encouragement, there were powerful moments of transformation: a young girl recommitted her life to Jesus, a father found emotional release through prayer for his daughter struggling with addiction, and leaders were renewed by the Holy Spirit. God's presence was felt, lifting spirits and creating genuine connections among all involved.









CLast week's laments (part of the group sessions) opened up a big wound I hadn't prioritized and wasn't ready to deal with. After spiralling for decades, I finally started the grief journey for this one thing. I hurt a lot, but now I have tools, and together with my weekly meetings with my professional counsellor, I am looking forward to finally healing. I am grateful I now have that hope." — Pastor Yonatan Hiruy

CARING FOR THE WOUNDED HEART

RECRUITS AND TRAINS MORE LEADERS

Every person trained in Bible-based Trauma Healing (TH) becomes a long-term agent of healing.

Trauma healing group sessions and personal work help participants identify their pain, share their suffering, and bring it to the Cross of Christ for healing. The Bible-based curriculum includes basic mental health concepts and helps individuals forgive those who caused their trauma. Facilitators progress from Apprentice to Certified to Master status, with training being the top priority. Notably, several remote Indigenous communities have embraced Caring for the Wounded Heart as a healing pathway.

Overcomers is a **Bible-based**, **12-step recovery and support program** revamped by CBS for a Canadian audience and designed to guide individuals toward freedom. Groups meet online or in person as they journey together.

FINDING FREEDOM

Overcomers has helped me grow closer in my relationship with God. It's been an incredible healing journey in this season in my life. It's enabled me to make new friends and find a sense of togetherness in my walk with God."

DIASPORA MINISTRY RAPIDLY EXPANDS

Diaspora churches in Canada, made up of immigrants and newcomers, are vibrant with outreach and deep spirituality, though limited resources hinder their ministry. CBS provides Scripture in their heart languages and hosts Intergenerational Seminars and preaching workshops for clergy and lay leaders. Our growing network connects newcomer leaders for mutual support.

VULNERABLE ELDERLY

The COVID-19 pandemic isolated seniors, creating significant challenges. In response, CBS launched audio Scriptures on user-friendly MegaVoice devices and giant-print Bibles. Five years later, MegaVoice players remain essential tools for chaplains, activity directors, and others serving seniors. Thank you for helping to bring comfort and warmth to seniors.

THE BIBLE COURSE EXPANDS ITS IMPACT ACROSS CANADA

Whether you're new to the Bible or well-versed, The Bible Course offers a powerful overview of Scripture through videos, diagrams, and interactive guides. Launched in 2020, it has impacted over 7,800 people across Canada.

MEGAVOICE GETTING A HEARING IN PRISONS

A CBS-led pilot in BC, in partnership with chaplains, showed that audio Bible devices can powerfully bring God's Word to inmates in Canada's correctional institutions.

"Many inmates have difficulty reading. Literacy, even with easy-to-read Bible translations, is a challenge for the guys. Having the Word of God in an audio format reduces that obstacle. Several inmates told me how hearing the Bible through the MegaVoice devices encouraged them and gave them hope on some hard days." — Prison Chaplain in B.C.

Thanks to our donors, in 2024, CBS provided inmates across Canada with 10,083 Bibles and 2,052 New Testaments. As funding allows, we plan to expand to federal and provincial institutions nationwide.




